Day 01: Cusco: Sightseeing tour and Nearby Ruins

Breakfast. Morning at leisure or we will take a visit by your own Street San Blas The artistic barrio (Neighborhood) of narrow and high streets beautiful little plaza and a beautiful paqcha exists; in this barrio numerous artists and artisans reside, there are located the workshops of famous artisans such as the family Mendevil Olave and merida, Panoramic views of Cusco City, Hatunrumivoc is located close to Plaza Nazarenas, not far from Plaza de Armas, It s a narrow pedestrian street. Famous for it's Inca walls where huge stones are precisely carved to fit together without mud or concrete. You'll find the masterpiece, a 12 Angled Stone, about halfway down the street The Inca stonework was incredible, actually so good that Spanish conquerors often used the old Inca structure as foundations for their own buildings. Hatunrumiyoc is a great place too have a closer look at their skills.







leisure The Central Market or Mercado de San Pedro is one of the oldest of Cusco, founded in 1925; despite its age it had no significant changes, but it still remains the largest center of concentration and supply of the city.

The **San Pedro Market** in Cusco sits about an eight minute walk south from Plaza de Armas but couldn't be more different!! On the walk to it you'll generally notice more and more street vendors and ladies in traditional dress sitting on the side of the streets selling nuts, popcorn and other small bags of dried foods. You'll spot more and more local shops (**Tiendas**) selling the most random of things all in the one tienda. If you're looking for an **alpaca** jumper, a freshly made juice, a bag of nectarines, some plantains to fry, **buttifaras** (**Ham sandwiches served on French bread**) or some cheesy gifts for your parents or friends back home you're definitely on your way to the right place!







In the afternoon, we will have a guided sightseeing tour of Cusco visiting the Main Square, the Cathedral and the Temple of the Sun or **Korikancha** Then, we drive out of the City to visit the Inca sites of Kenko, Tambomachay, Puca Pucara and the impressive Fortress of **Sacsayhuaman**, strategically built on a hill overlooking Cusco and famous for its enormous carved stones, some of them standing over 9m / 30ft high and weighing over 350 tons.

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at 20.00 p.m. evening get ready to enjoy a dinner with a folklore show in a typical restaurant where the musicians play their melodies with Andean instruments of beautiful sounds, while typically dressed dancers will show you different ancient Peruvian dances.

Day 02: Cusco: Sacred Valley of the Incas – Aguas Calientes (Machupicchu Town)
Early morning excursion to the Urubamba Valley, the Sacred Valley of the Incas. Visit to the picturesque indian Pisac Market held on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Sundays, the shopping paradise of the Andes where barter is still practiced. Enjoy the unique atmosphere during a typical lunch. In the afternoon, passing through the Towns of Calca and Urubamba, we visit the Inca Fortress and Citadel of Ollantaytambo, built to guard the entrance to this part of the Valley, and protect it from possible invasion from the tribes in the Lower jungle. You can walk through the quaint streets of the nearby Town, and get a good idea of what this strategic Mlitary, Religious, and Agricultural Centre was like during the era of the Inca Empire.







Day 03: Aguas Calientes (Machupicchu Town) Machu Picchu - Sun Gate - Cusco rise to Bus Station for a 20' journey to the famous Inca Citadel of Machu Picchu, also known as "The Lost City of the Incas". bus drive, climbing 6km of winding road, to the incredible site of Huayna Picchu also known as Wayna Picchu (Quechua " Young Peak ") The number of daily visitors allowed to enter Huayna Picchu is restricted to 200 is a mountain in Peru around which the Urubamba River bends. It rises over Machupicchu, the so - called lost city of the Incas, and divides it into sections. The Incas built a trail up the side of the Huayna Picchu and built temples and terraces on its top. The peak of Huayna Picchu is about 2,720 meters (8,920 ft) above sea level, or about 360 meters (1,180 ft) higher than Machu Picchu. According to local guides, the top of the mountain was the residence for the high priest and the local virgins.







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Machupicchu Every morning before sunrise, the high priest with a small group would walk to Machu Picchu to signal the coming of the new day. The Temple of the Moon, one of the three major temples in the Machu Picchu area, is nestled on the side of the mountain and is situated at an elevation lower than Machu Picchu. Adjacent to the Temple of the Moon is the Great Cavern, another sacred temple with fine masonry. The other major local temples in Machu Picchu are the Temple of the Condor, Temple of Three Windows, Principal Temple, "Unfinished Temple", and the Temple of the Sun, also called the Torreon. Then we'll participate in a guided tour of the Citadel, visiting the Main Plaza, the Circular Tower, The Sacred Sun Dial the Royal Quarters, the Temple of the Three Windows and various burial grounds.







The Sun Gates of Machu Picchu boast a picture - perfect vantage point overlooking Peru's most famous ruins. Tourists flock to this outcrop high in the Andes Mountains to enjoy the same view featured on virtually every postcard depicting the Machu Picchu citadel. Also known as Inti Punku, the Sun Gates consist of two stones perched at a narrow passage in the crevice of the mountain just above Machu Picchu. The sun shines brilliantly through this portal each day when it rises - hence the name.







Garden Waterfall of Mandor - Hot Spring - Cuzco

Excellent opportunity to enjoy a stroll through the Town of Aguas Calientes and visit its Hot Springs Thermal Waters. Then, you will have time to perform some of the following activities: MANDOR WATERFALLS. Visiting Mandor Waterfall is an unforgettable adventure. It is an area of lush forest surrounding the town of Machu Picchu. You just have to follow the railway line from Machu Picchu Pueblo for a 45 minute-hike. You will reach a railway crossing, from which you will see a small group of houses whose dwellers will tell you how to reach Mandor Waterfall







Hot Spring

Is a distance of 800 m. east of the town of Machupicchu, there are under ground hot sulfur springs wich bubble up from the rocky under ground at varying temperatures. The especially – Built pools at this resort are the basis of its use as hot mineral baths. The hot spring offer

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natural resources for medical therapy, and also is a great treatment for Rheumatism. It help to rid of stress and toxins, anhance your metabolism and avoid high blood pressure. The average temperature of the water runs from 38° to 46°C. There are also changing rooms, bathrooms sand and a small snack bar. at 14.30 p.m or 19.00 p.m train back to Cuzco upon arrivel transfer to your selected hotel for overnight.

Day 04: Puno - Cusco (389 kms = 08 hrs)

Breakfast. Early departure by bus to the City of Cusco. We travel along the High Plateau of Collao, stopping at the Town of Ayaviri, an important livestock and textile centre, to visit the impressive Temple of Kalasaya, ruins from the ancient Pucara Culture. On the way, we stop in Raqchi, where we can see a spectacular Inca Sanctuary built by the Inca Pachacutec, and dedicated to the great Inca God of Wiracocha. It has a great central wall with a stone base of fine Inca architecture. Other walls are made of giant adobe bricks. The structure also has two circular lateral columns. Around the Temple are several buildings once used for housing and storage. About 70 km further on, we pass through the La Raya Ranch where we can see troops of vicuñas and llamas. During the trip, we pass by the lovely Wacarpay Lake, offering spectacular views of the mountains reflected in its calm waters.

We proceed to the beautiful Town of Andahuaylillas, and visit the Church of San Pedro de Andahuaylillas, better known as the Sistine Chapel of the Americas, due to its decorated polychrome ceiling. Buffet lunch in a quiet countryside restaurant, where we can enjoy the delightful culinary art of the Region. Upon arrival in Cusco, meet and transfer to your hotel. Dinner on your own.

Day 05: Puno: Titicaca Lake, Floating Islands of the Uros and Taquile Island - Puno
Early in the morning, we will have an unforgettable by tourist motorboat excursion on the
waters of Lake Titicaca to the unique "Floating Islands" of the Uros. These ancient
inhabitants of the lake, known as the Water Tribe, have built their own "Islands" by periodically
adding new layers of a type of reed called "Totora" (Scirpus Totora), vegetable fibre of the
Papyrus family. Their homes and boats are also made from this material. We continue our
motorboat trip to Taquile Island, inhabited by Quechua - Speaking Natives who have
developed, down through generations, an efficient and unique social system, as well as fine
hand weaving techniques. It is necessary to go up a stairway of more than 567 steps - steps of
stone that wind their way among green platforms - to arrive at the Town of Taquile where we will
have a break to eat. After lunch in a local Taquile Inn, we have a walk through the various hills
and archaeological sites of this 6 km long Island. In the afternoon, return to Puno for overnight
at your hotel. Evening free.

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Day 06: Juliaca - Lima - Trujillo

p.m. Arrive in Trujillo, transfer to the selected hotel, **Trujillo**, spring is eternal. The sun always shines, filling even the most secluded corners of the capital of the department of La Libertad with light. This light brightens the spirit of an affable and cordial people, who live proud of their adobe citadels built by the Chimus and Mochicas; their stately mansions, heritage of colonial times and the beginnings of the Republic; and of the 'marinera', the national dance of Peru, a whirl of sensuality and gallantry from which love is born. **Trujillo**, in the northern coast of Peru, was founded in 1534 by Don Diego de Almagro, who, on stopping in the valley of the Moche river on his advance toward Pachacamac (**Lima**), "**Found the place promising and suitable for founding a city** ", and named it after the Spanish city where conquistador Francisco Pizarro was born. From the day of its foundation, the city progressed rapidly owing to the productivity of the valley and the tenacity of its people; builders of stately mansions with outstanding artistic window railings in wrought iron, adding a touch of distinction and elegance to **Trujillo's** architecture.

Day 07: Temple of the Sun, Moon, Chan Chan & Huanchaco

After breakfast. Excursion 15 minutes South of Trujillo to visit the enormous adobe constructions built by the Mochica Culture in the 5th century, called Temple of the Sun, considered the largest adobe pyramid in Peru and the Temple of the Moon, housing an extensive burial ground and some fine polychrome murals in which their deity is often printed. Is believed that both were complementary, one administrative and the other religious. Proceed to Huanchaco Beach, well frequented by beach-goers and surfers, you will have the opportunity to appreciate the local fishermen surfing the waves in their traditional " Caballitos de Totora ", little reed boats used for fishing since pre Inca times, visit the largest mud archaeological complex of the pre-Hispanic America, Chan Chan, ancient Capital of the Chimu Empire (13th Century), visiting the Temple del Arco Iris, the site museum and the Tshudi Palace.

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Day 08: Trujillo - El Brujo Complex - Cajamarca - Celendin 7 hrs

After breakfast, drive 30 minutes North from Trujillo to the archaeological complex of El Brujo (the Shaman) containing three large buildings constructed in different eras: Huaca Prieta, the oldest construction on the Peruvian Coast; Huaca El Brujo, a pyramid from the Mochica Culture and Huaca Cao Viejo, with an old Christian church. Actually, scientific works are being done on its magnificent and recently discovered remains.







At noom You will tavel by private car to the City of Celendin - Cajamarca is located in the northern highlands of Peru and is the capital of the Cajamarca Region It is approximately 2,700 m (8,900 ft) above sea level and has a population of about 217,000 people. Cajamarca has an equatorial climate so it is mild, dry and sunny, which creates very fertile soil. The city is well-known for its cheeses and dairy products. Cajamarca is also known for its churches, and hot springs, or Inca Baths. There are also several active mining sites in surrounding areas. Most of all, Peruvians remember Cajamarca as the place where the Inca Empire came to an end; the Battle of Cajamarca and the capture, abuse, and murder of the Incan emperor Atahualpa took place here

Day 09: Celendin - Leymebamba (9 hrs)

After breakfast drive by private car to Leymebamba, upon arrivel transfer to the selected hotel.







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Inaugurated in June 2000, the Museo Leymebamba displays the more than 200 mummies and their burial offerings recovered in 1997 from the Laguna de los Cóndores by a salvage Project directed by Centro Mallqui. Once at risk from looters and vandals, today this valuable collection is housed in the Museo Leymebamba. An initiative of The Bioanthropology Foundation Peru-Centro Mallqui, the Museo Leymebamba's construction was made possible by a donation from a group of Austrian citizens as well as by funds from private donors. In 1999 Centro Mallqui carried out excavations at the small settlement on the north side of the lake. Known today as Llagtacocha, or town-on-the-lake, the site covers about 33 hectares and includes the remains of some 130, mostly circular structures, probably home to the people interred in the chullpas across the lake. Excavations at Llaqtacocha unearthed Chachapoya and provincial Inca ceramics, indicating that the settlement and the chullpa site across the lake are contemporary. The site may have been founded as early as AD 1200, and it includes rectangular structures that point to the Inca occupation as well as buildings that may have been built in early Spanish Colonial times. Llagtacocha has been severely damaged by forest clearing to open pastures for cattle. The trees toppled the site's walls and subsequent burning shattered limestone building blocks. Cattle range freely, tumbling the few remaining walls and trampling the site's ancient drainage system. As a result, few of Llagtacocha's walls stand higher than 1 meter. Llagtacocha boasts an especially elaborate drainage network. Stone faced canals wind their way through the settlement and small, stone slab bridges provided access to the half-moon cornices surrounding the house foundation platforms. Some cornices, curiously, were built on supporting walls and are not freestanding, serving as ramps leading to the doors of the houses.

Day 10: Leymebamba - Kuelap - Chachapoyas

Early morning we will drive in private car to the Fortress Kuelap known as " The Machu Picchu of the North ". Kuelap has over 400 buildings inside 3 levels of walls, and is the largest stone structure in all South America. Orchids and bromeliads cover the walls and trees inside this fortress. On the way to Chachapoyas we will observe the platforms of Macro located on a cliff overlooking the Utcubamba River.







Day 11: Chachapoyas - Karajia - Chachapoyas - Chiclayo

Sarcophagus of Karajia are precariously located on a mountain cliff at about 2600m. It is an spectacular funerary site down the road about a mile and a quarter. Here we will find 2 meter anthropomorphic wooden coffins located under a cliff. Mummies were placed inside each coffin. It is easy to get the area requires a walk, the Chachapoyas buried their dead in capsule-like tombs constructed of straw clay and mud also using bamboo to make the shape of the body, known locally as purunmachus (from the Quechua, purun wild and machu, old), Here six sarcophagus remain looking west, down toward the valley below, where the river runs, all six of

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them with three skulls, two above them, ome one on the cliff floor, beside them The purunmachus were constructed by first the body decorated with painted relief designs, directly on a ledge around the funerary bundle, covering the bundle that rests in a fetus position in the center of these hollow statues, and long bamboos inserted into the construction to give the shape of the body. Next, the capsule was covered in mud mixed with straw and painted white or cream. Finally, details such as necklaces or pectorals, feathered tunics, facial traits or face paint and genitals were added in shades of yellow ocre and two shades of red, probably an ochre and hematite for the darker red. Night bus to Chiclayo

a.m. Arrive in Chiclayo transfer to the selected hoteel morning to rest p.m. A vacation of cultural and archaeological discovery that begins with a city tour of Chiclayo, including the twin - domed neoclassical Cathedral, the Paseo de las Musas park, and city's famous " Shaman " market. sessions Or folks healers, sell the herbs and paraphemalia used in their healing

Day 13: Tucume Archeological complex of Huaca Rajada & Musuem Royal Tombs of the Lord of Sipan

After breakfast, drive 40 minutes from Chiclayo to visit the archaeological complex of Tucume or Valley of the Pyramids, an important archaeological complex of the Lambayeque Culture (BC 1,000 / 1,350 AD), consisting of pyramids from which the extensive pre-Columbian urban site can be surveyed. excursion to the impressive Necropolis of Huaca Rajada, a Mochica funeral centre where a great number of tombs have been discovered and where the tombs of the Old Lord of Sipan (3rd Century) and the Lord of Sipan (5th Century), famous for its objects in gold and semi-precious stones, were unearthed in the decade of the 1980's by Peruvian archaeologists led by Dr. Walter Alva. visit to the Royal Tombs of Sipan Museum, where we can appreciate a Lord of Sipan Tomb replica, additionally we will see several ceramic pieces. Nowadays, this museum is one of the best and modern in South America

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Day 14: Chiclayo - Lima

a.m. Transfer to Chiclayo Airport for your fly to Lima upon arrivel transfer to the selected hotel today we wil have guided sightseeing tour to the most attractive and important sites in Lima, the "City of Kings". The tour includes Lima's Historical Centre, passing by Plaza San Martin, The Main Plaza, the Government Palace, the City Hall, the Cathedral and its Religious Art Museum, the Church of Santo Domingo, with the tombs of Santa Rosa and San Martin de Porras, and Lima's Colonial Balconies. We will visit the Convent and Church of San Francisco, the greatest monumental complex of Colonial Art in America and Cultural Heritage of Humanity. The tour includes a visit to the Basilica of 21 altars, Convent of Cloisters, Capitulary and Clementine Rooms, Chorus and Library of the Monks, a Museum showing 11 paintings of the Rubens School, the Sacristy with paintings of Zurbaran and Ribera, its great patio decorated with Seville tiles of XVIth Century, Moorish arches and underground Catacombs. We will also visit El Olivar Park with olive trees brought from Spain in the XVth Century, the Central Park of Miraflores and Larcomar, a symbol of modern Lima and a tourist and entertainment centre as well as a privileged site to enjoy an amazing view of the Pacific Ocean.

Optional Leymebamba Trek

Day 01: Departure between 7 and 8 in the morning by car or on horseback for 30 minutes. That we begin our journey. We put the luggage and the food in the horses and we begin our adventure. We climb from 2230 mt to 3800 mt, then we go down to 3,500 mt where we arrive at the Stone Forest where we will take our lunch. This part takes about 5 hours on horseback. After lunch we will descend to 2,600 m where we have the first impressive view of the Laguna de los Cóndores. We arrived at our basic cottage between 5:00 p.m. and 6:00 p.m. Here at night we had our hot meal. In the hostel we slept in the room for 4 people. The hostel is located in the cloud forest. Along

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the way we will find many species of birds.

Day 02: Lodge - Tombs - Lodge

Breakfast, 2 hours and a half walk to the Laguna de los Cóndores or Laguna de las Momias. We will visit Llagtacocha or " Pueblo sobre la Laguna " which is the old residential site on the north side of the lagoon. Around this beautiful lagoon are the old constructions (Mausoleums) whose interiors found funerary bundles and handicrafts, which have now been transferred to the Leymebamba museum, as well as about 219 mummies. Covered by the cloud forest, on the eastern flanks of the Andes, a row of tombs hangs over the waters of a lagoon. Concealed in a narrow natural shelter, 100 meters above the Laguna de los Cóndores, the structures remained abandoned for almost 500 years. The mausoleums were built using a natural ledge of the cliff. Each tomb is approximately 3 meters high and is divided into two levels. The structures are basically quadrangular, built in blocks of limestone laid with mud mortar. Some of these structures are plastered and painted in shades of white pigment and reddish and yellow ocher, while others are adorned with zigzag friezes and a display of deer antlers. All have windows facing the lagoon and towards the old settlement of Llagtacocha. This adventure will allow you to enjoy all the beauty and history that surrounds this sacred site where were deposited the highest leaders of the culture of the Chachapova, which were later also used by the Incas. Observation and guided visit. Lunch, in the afternoon return to accommodation, rest afternoon free for rest or for boating on the lagoon and fishing trout. Dinner, overnight.
