## Inca Trail to Machupicchu & Galapagos Islands

### Day 01: International Arrivel in Lima

Assistance on your arrival in Lima and transfer to your selected hotel. Free time to rest and prepare for starting your trip around this unusual city and magical country.

### Day 02: Lima - Cusco: Sightseeing Tour and Nearby Ruins

Breakfast. Transfer to Lima airport for your flight to Cuzco upon arrival transfer to the selected hotel, Morning at leisure. Couple minutes from your hotel can visit on foot **San Blas Street** This neighborhood housing artisans, workshops and craft shops, is one of the most picturesque sites in the city. Its streets are steep and narrow with old houses built by the Spanish over important Inca foundations. It has an attractive square and the oldest parish church in Cuzco, built in 1563, which has a carved wooden pulpit considered the epitome of Colonial era woodwork in Cuzco. The Quechua name of this neighborhood is *Toq'ocachi* which means the opening of the Salt



### 12 - angled Stone The Magic of Inca Stones:

Dominating the ancient streets of Cusco are dramatic Inca walls, constructed of mammoth granite blocks so exquisitely carved that they fit together without mortar, like jigsaw-puzzle pieces. The Spaniards razed many Inca constructions but built others right on top of the original foundations. ( **Even hell - bent on destruction, they recognized the value of good engineering.** ) In many cases, colonial architecture has not stood up nearly as well as the Incas' bold structures, which were designed to withstand the immensity of seismic shifts common in this part of Peru. Apart from the main attractions detailed in this section, a brief walking tour will take you past some of the finest Inca constructions that remain in the city. East

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of the Plaza de Armas, Calle Loreto is one of the best-known Inca thoroughfares. The massive wall on the left side, composed of meticulously cut rectangular stones, was once part of the Acclahuasi, or the " **House of the Chosen Maidens**," the Inca emperor's Virgins of the Sun. This is the oldest surviving Inca wall in Cusco and one of the most distinguished. Northeast of the Plaza de Armas, off Calle Palacio, is Hatunrumiyoc, a cobblestone street lined with impressive walls of polygonal stones. Past the Archbishop's Palace on the right side is the famed 12 - Angled Stone ( **now appropriated as the symbol of Cuzqueña beer** ), which is magnificently fitted into the wall. Originally, this wall belonged to the palace of the Inca Roca. This large stone is impressively cut; the Incas almost routinely fitted many - cornered stones ( **with as many as 32, as seen at Machu Picchu, or even 44 angles** ) into structures. From Hatunrumiyoc, make your first right down another pedestrian alleyway, Inca Roca; about halfway down on the right side is a series of stones said to form the shape of a puma, including the head, large paws, and tail. It's not all that obvious, so if you see someone else studying the wall, ask him to point out the figure. Siete Culebras ( **Seven Snakes** ), the alleyway connecting Plaza Nazarenas to Choquechaca, contains Inca stones that form the foundation of the chapel within the Hotel Monasterio. Other streets with notable Inca foundations are Herrajes, Pasaje Arequipa, and Santa Catalina Angosta. Only a couple genuine Inca portals remain



In the afternoon, we will have a guided sightseeing tour of Cusco visiting the Main Square, the Cathedral and the Temple of the Sun or **Korikancha**. Then, we drive out of the City to visit the Inca sites of Kenko, Tambomachay, Puca Pucara and the impressive Fortress of **Sacsayhuaman**, strategically built on a hill overlooking Cusco and famous for its enormous carved stones, some of them standing over 9m / 30ft high and weighing over 350 tons.



**at 20.00 p.m.** evening get ready to enjoy a dinner with a folklore show in a typical restaurant where the musicians play their melodies with Andean instruments of beautiful sounds, while typically dressed dancers will show you different ancient Peruvian dances.

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## Day 03: Cusco - Rainbow Mountain - Cusco

A fantastic day tour ( **with trekking** ) to the so - called 7 Color Mountain, leaving from Cusco. Located in southern Peru, in the Cusco region, this route will take you through stunning landscapes with glaciers, snowcapped mountains and crystal clear rivers and lakes. Pass by local villages of Quechua descendants and explore the breathtaking surrounding nature. The colors of the Rainbow Mountain will leave you speechless. You will be picked up from your accommodation at around 3.00am and start making your way to Arco ( **on the route to Puno** ) eventually getting to the Checacupe district ( **2 hour journey** ). Then we will continue to Pitumarca and a number of small villages till we reach the Hanchipata - Quesuno community ( **another 1.5 hours** ). From here we start our hike. We will be able to enjoy the view of numerous mountains around as well as the Ausangate glacier, and we will be able to witness up close the local wildlife and camelids in their natural environment. The trek lasts for about 3 hours until we get to the stunning landscape of Vinicunca ( **Rainbow Mountains** ). Here we will have about one hour to relax and take amazing pictures of this natural wonder. We then hike back to the starting point of the trek, and from there return to Cusco ( **arriving at approximately 17.00** ).

## Day 04: Cusco: Sacred Valley of the Incas - Sanctuary of Ccochahuasi - Pisac Market - Perilnoyoc Waterfall - Hanging Hotel ( Sky Lodge ) Ollantaytambo ( Private guide and car )

Early morning excursion to the Urubamba Valley, the Sacred Valley of the Incas. on our way 30' from Cusco we can stop in Ccochahuasi Animal Sanctuary ( **Santuario Animal de Cochahuasi** ) The family-run and privately owned Ccochahuasi Animal Sanctuary rescues and rehabilitates animals that have been ill-treated or victims of poaching. Visitors can tour the grounds and meet some of the rescued animals, such as pumas, Peruvian hairless dogs, alpacas, and llamas, as well as the gigantic Andean condor

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After getting to know the animals, you can take some time to visit some of the small **onsite exhibits**, where you can understand how the animals wool is refined and naturally dyed, before finally being expertly woven into fabrics, tapestry's, clothing or a variety of other products. Women from native communities offer live examples of traditional ( **and intricate** ) weaving techniques, using basic tools and wooden looms.

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Visit to the picturesque Indian Pisac Market held on **Tuesdays, Thursdays and Sundays**, the shopping paradise of the Andes where barter is still practiced. Enjoy the unique atmosphere during a typical lunch. In the afternoon, passing through the Towns of Calca and Urubamba, we visit the Inca Fortress and Citadel of Ollantaytambo, built to guard the entrance to this part of the Valley, and protect it from possible invasion from the tribes in the Lower jungle. You can walk through the quaint streets of the nearby Town, and get a good idea of what this strategic Military, Religious, and Agricultural Centre was like during the era of the Inca Empire.



## Waterfall of Perolnuyoc

Hike to the Waterfall and Archaeological Site of Perolnuyoc is an unusual tour that mixes the cultural with ecotourism. A tour that will take you deep into the sacred valley and you will appreciate one of the spectacular works of nature hidden in a forest of abundant vegetation, you will be able to refresh yourself in its crystal clear waters. We will also visit the archaeological center that sits on top of the Racaypata or Perolnuyoc waterfall. we will have lunch in a family house of **Rural community in Socma** they will teach You how to hew a variety of Marble stone. The most representative dish is La Merienda ( **Meal with Corn, Guinea Pig, Special Tortilla** ) The typical drink is the chicha made of fermented corn " **Chicha de Jora** " and frutillada, fermented strawberry last one. The most relevant celebrations are on May 03rd " **Cruz**

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**Velacuy** " festivity to the cross of Jesus Crist and on August 02nd " **Angels Virgins** " with typical dances,



Then we will stop for 5' to see a Hanging Hotel, sleep in this hotel, people must climb 400 mt. of Via Ferrata or hike an intrepid trail through ziplines. One night at this place will make your dreams come true. This hotel is composed of three exclusive capsule Suites with a total capacity of 8 people. The vertically hanging transparent capsule suites are situated at the top of our 1200 ft mountain with a 300 degree view of the majestic Sacred Valley. Hand crafted out of aerospace aluminum and weather resistant polycarbonate, each suite comes complete with four beds, a dining area and a private bathroom



At the end we will visit Ollantaytambo Ruins lie in the town of Ollantaytambo situated approximately 60km from Cusco at the end of the Sacred Valley and are a great example of Incan architecture. In the mid-15th century the Inca Emperor Pachacuti conquered the town of Ollantaytambo and re-built it as a religious, political and military complex as well as a resting place for the Inca nobility. During the Spanish conquest of Peru, Ollantaytambo served as headquarters for Manco Inca the resistance leader who retreated to Ollantaytambo following his defeat in the siege of Cusco in 1536. He then subsequently successfully defeated the Spanish in a battle at Ollantaytambo by flooding the valley below. The Spanish led by Hernando Pizarro subsequently returned with a far greater army and eventually took control of Ollantaytambo while Manco Inca fled to the city of Vilcabamba. The fortress is located on the western side in the area known as Aracma Ayllu and is made up of a series of imposing, terraces, temples, platforms, paths and walls and offers excellent views of the surrounding countryside, the town of Ollantaytambo itself and the Incan storehouses or 'Qollqa' built on the Pincuylluna mountain opposite the ruins.

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## Day 05: Cusco - Km82 - Huayllabamba

At approximately 6:30 am, our guide will pick you up from your hotel to transfer you by bus to the km 82 where you will arrive at approx. 10:30 am. Here you will meet the team that will join you during the trek, such as the porters, camp assistants and cooks. You will begin the walk, the first day is quite easy and during the first kilometres you will have a beautiful view of the snow peaked Veronica Mountain, walking alongside the Vilcanota River until you arrive at the Archaeological Complex of Patallacta, where you will have lunch and gain energy to reach Huayllabamba, where the first camp is set up.

## Day 06: Huayllabamba - Pacaymayo

After breakfast, the hardest part of the trail begins, with a steep ascent, followed by 3 hours walking until reaching the first step, called Warmiwañusca ( **Dead Woman** ), up to 4200 m.a.s.l. approximately. You will not only enjoy incredible panoramic views from here but you will also have the satisfaction to have reached the top. After lunch in Vizcachayoc we will descend towards Pacaymayo ( **3500 m.a.s.l.** ) for dinner and camp.

## Day 07: Pacaymayo - Wiñayhuayna

After breakfast the ascent will begin until the second most important step of the route, up to 3900 m.a.s.l., where you will enjoy a guided visit to the Archaeological Complex **Runkurakay** and the Inca Citadel of **Sayacmarca** ( **3,600 m.a.s.l.** ). Lunch in Chaquicocha. Then, you will continue walking towards **Phuya Patamarca** ( **Town in Clouds** ), another important

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archaeological monument. After a brief rest, we will continue walking until arriving at Wiñay Huayna (Always Young), for a guided visit to this spectacularly located Archaeological Complex . Dinner and overnight in the camp. Note: The above are the regular camp sites according to the circuit operated by Enjoy Peru, however, these can vary according to disposition levied by the Machu Picchu Management Unit without previous warning, but which will not affect the itinerary.

**Day 08: Wiñayhuayna - Huaynapicchu - Machupicchu - Cusco**

After breakfast ( **05:00 approx.**), start walking for one hour by the forest until the Inti Punku ( **Door of the Sun** ), known like the front door to Machu Picchu, from where we will be able to have an impressive panoramic view of the Inca Citadel.



climbing 6 km of winding road, to the incredible site of **Huayna Picchu** also known as **Wayna Picchu** ( **Quechua** " **Young Peak** " ) The number of daily visitors allowed to enter Huayna Picchu is restricted to 200 is a mountain in Peru around which the Urubamba River bends. It rises over Machupicchu, the so-called lost city of the Incas, and divides it into sections. The Incas built a trail up the side of the Huayna Picchu and built temples and terraces on its top. The peak of Huayna Picchu is about 2,720 metres ( **8,920 ft** ) above sea level, or about 360 metres ( **1,180 ft** ) higher than Machu Picchu. According to local guides, the top of the mountain was the residence for the high priest and the local virgins.



**After climb Huaynapicchu we go down to Machupicchu ruins**, you will have a guided tour of the ruins and monuments, such as the Main Square, the Circular Tower, the Sacred Solar

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Clock, the Royal Quarters, the Temple of the Three Windows and the cemeteries. Free time to stroll around the Citadel and then meet the rest of the group to be transferred by bus to Aguas Calientes for lunch (not included). In the afternoon return to Cusco by train. Upon arrival in Cusco, transfer to your selected hotel. **Machupicchu** Every morning before sunrise, the high priest with a small group would walk to Machu Picchu to signal the coming of the new day. The **Temple of the Moon**, one of the three major temples in the Machu Picchu area, is nestled on the side of the mountain and is situated at an elevation lower than Machu Picchu. Adjacent to the Temple of the Moon is the Great Cavern, another sacred temple with fine masonry. The other major local temples in Machu Picchu are the Temple of the Condor, Temple of Three Windows, Principal Temple, " **Unfinished Temple** ", and the Temple of the Sun, also called the Torreón. Then we'll participate in a guided tour of the Citadel, visiting the Main Plaza, the Circular Tower, **The Sacred Sun Dial** the Royal Quarters, the Temple of the Three Windows and various burial grounds.



## **Machupicchu Museum & Orchid Garden**

The museum has the aspect of a small rural house, but at the same time dynamic and modern, where you can find around 400 cultural pieces divided in 7 rooms, that explain in the simplest and most enjoyable way the history and significance of Machu Picchu. Among the best examples displayed in the museum the following stand out: the constructive tools of copper and bronze, as well as pins and anthropomorphic representations, a clear proof of metallurgical ability of the Incas; we can also find lithic objects and vessels made of clay, possibly used to do rituals. The site museum also offers visitors the possibility to explore the "Orquideario" (**The Orchid Garden**), with more than 400 species of plants and a "Mariposario" (**Butterfly Garden**) that houses species unique in the world. **The Andean Cock-of-the-Rock** is Peru's national bird. One of the most famous birds of Peru with stunning head-dress of orange-red feathers that remind some of the orange-red fringe that Incas used to wear as a badge of his rank.

## **Day 09: Lima City Tours**

a.m. Transfer to Cusco Airport for our fly to Lima, transfer Hotel, City Tours guided sightseeing tour to the most attractive and important sites in Lima, the " **City of Kings** ". The tour includes

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Lima's Historical Centre, passing by Plaza San Martin, The Main Plaza, the Government Palace, the City Hall, the Cathedral and its Religious Art Museum, the Church of Santo Domingo, with the tombs of Santa Rosa and San Martin de Porras, and Lima's Colonial Balconies. We will visit the Convent and Church of San Francisco, the greatest monumental complex of Colonial Art in America and Cultural Heritage of Humanity. The tour includes a visit to the Basilica of 21 altars, Convent of Cloisters, Capitulary and Clementine Rooms, Chorus and Library of the Monks, a Museum showing 11 paintings of the Rubens School, the Sacristy with paintings of Surbaran and Ribera, its great patio decorated with Seville tiles of XVth Century, Moorish arches and underground Catacombs. We will also visit El Olivar Park with olive trees brought from Spain in the XVth Century, the Central Park of Miraflores and Larcomar, a symbol of modern Lima and a tourist and entertainment center as well as a privileged site to enjoy an amazing view of the Pacific Ocean.

**Day 10: Lima - Tumbes - Guayaquil ( Ecuador )**

Time required transfer to Lima Airport for your flight to Tumbes border between Peru & Ecuador upon arrival transfer to Guayaquil in Private car and Guide transfer to the selected hostel or hotel

**Day 11: Guayaquil - Baltra Rancho Primicias & Twin Craters**

Upon arrival in Baltra Airport transfer to Santa Cruz, a guide will be waiting for You to take to the hotel, where You can leave your luggage. We will seize the morning to visit the Rancho Primicias in the island's highlands where we will be able to see Giant Turtles in their habitat



Then we go on to Lava Tubes " **There are eight lava tubes on Isla Santa Cruz** " The largest lava tubes in the Galapagos are on Santa Cruz Island, it's estimated that the last eruptions

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occurred around a million and a half years ago. There is a gigantic lava tunnel that is over 2000 meters long on the Island that many tourist visit and walk through



Los Gemelos ( **Twin Craters** ) are located in the highlands of Santa Cruz Island. They are not actual craters caused by impact, but are sink holes that were created when the volcanic roof of empty magma chambers collapsed from tectonic shifts and erosion over time. This area has very different climate from other parts of the island and are surrounded by scalesia ( scalesia pedunculata ) forests, which our tour guide kept calling "broccoli trees." It is the habitat for bromeliads, orchids, mosses, lichens and many birds. Here, you are able to find the famous vermilion flycatcher, 8 species of Charles Darwin finches, and every so often short - eared owls.

## Day 12: Grietas & Tortuga Bay

After breakfast we will Hike through a forest of enormous cacti and over rugged lava rock formations to one of the most unique swimming holes in the Galapagos Islands. Las Grietas, which translates literally to mean " **The Cracks,** " is a series of volcanic crevices that were formed during the cooling of molten lava. The porous lava stone of the island allows water to filter down from the highlands into Las Grietas where it mixes with sea water filtering in from the ocean. The resulting azure waters are crystalline and refreshing Las Grietas is a popular swimming destination for locals and visitors alike. Float blissfully in the cool water -- or get your adrenaline pumping by jumping from the new wooden platform. A Naturalist Guide is not required to visit as the trail has been improved, but it is not recommended to travel alone as the jagged lava rocks en route can be tricky.



After Lunch we will walk to Tortuga Bay It's located on the Santa Cruz Island, about a 20 minutes' walk from the main water taxi dock in Puerto Ayora, The walking path is 1.55 miles ( **2,490 m** ) and is open from 06.00 to 18.00 p.m. evening, we must sign in and out at the start of

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the path with The Galapagos Park Service Office, Tortuga Bay has a gigantic, perfectly preserved beach, that is forbidden to swimmers and is preserved for the wildlife where many Marine Iguanas, Galapagos Crabs and Birds are seen dotted along the Volcanic Rocks. There is a separate cove where You can swim and where it's common to view White Tip Reef Sharks swimming in groups & on occasion Tiger Shark The Genus , Galeocerdo, is divided from the Greek galeos, which mean Shark and The Latin Cerdus, The Word for the hard hairs of Pigs. It is often colloquially called the Man – Eater Shark. The Galapagos Shark a top other species of Shark that are found in The Galapagos Islands, There are always a large variety of small fish and Birds

**Day 13: Santa Cruz Island to Isabela Island ( Flamingos Lagoon & Sea Kayaking with Penguins )**

a.m. Transfer to The Pier to catch the speed Boat to Isabela Island, It's the largest Island of The Galapagos with an area of 4,640 square kilometers ( **1,790 sq mi** ), and length of 100 kilometers ( **62 mi** ) almost four times larger than Santa Cruz, the second largest of the archipelago. It was named after Queen Isabela of Spain. It was originally named *Albemarle* after the Duke of Albemarle. The island strides the Equator. Isabela is also interesting for its flora and fauna. The young island does not follow the vegetation zones of the other islands. The relatively new lava fields and surrounding soils have not developed the sufficient nutrients required to support the varied life zones found on other islands. Another obvious difference occurs on Volcan Wolf and Cerro Azul; these volcanoes loft above the cloud cover and are arid on top. Isabela's rich animal, Bird and Marine life is beyond compare. Isabela is home to more wild Tortoise than all the other islands. Isabela's large size and notable topography created barriers for the slow - moving tortoises; apparently the creatures were unable to cross lava flows and other obstacles, causing several different sub - species of Tortoise to develop. Today, Tortoises roam free in the calderas of Alcedo, Wolf, Cerro Azul, Darwin and Sierra Negra



Arrive in Isabela transfer to the selected hostel or hotel after checking we will walk around to Flamingos Lagoon an expansive coastal lagoon that serves as one of the primary breeding grounds for Flamingos

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In the afternoon we take our ocean kayaks and paddle out to the pier of Isabela, a set of small islets within Isabela Bay. The islets are filled with wildlife and are home to the Galapagos penguin, the only penguin that lives in equatorial region. We will also see sharks, marine turtles, sea lions, Blue Footed Bobies and much more wildlife as we explore its many small coves and beaches.

## Day 14: Tunnels & Wall of Tears

After breakfast we will go to the pier for a 45 minute fibra ( a small boat ) ride to a place where Lava flow impacted with the oceans waves to form the stunning tubes and bridges of Los Tunnels. Los Tunneles is a marine paradise for the White tipped Reef Shark, Manta Rays, Parrot Fish, Yellowtail Surgeon Fish, Galápagos Green Sea Turtle and the Galápagos Sea Lion. This site is one of the most is one of the most spectacular places for snorkeling in Isabela as the water is shallow, clear and calm. This marine sanctuary is characterized by its unique geologic formations. A series of lava flows have produced a number of arches and tunnels both under and above water, where you find a number of animal species that have taken up residence in these magnificent formations. As soon as you get to the intertidal starting point you will be released to snorkel through astoundingly beautiful site.



**The Wall of Tears** ( Spanish: El Muro de las Lágrimas ) is a historical site 5 km west of Puerto Villamil on Isabela Island in the Galapagos Islands, Ecuador. It was constructed between the years of 1945 and 1959 by prisoners in the Penal Colony on the island, which had been established by President Jose Maria Velasco Ibarra in 1944, using infrastructure left by the US military after World War II. The wall is about 25 m ( 65 ft ) tall and is said to have been the cause of thousands of deaths during its construction. Locals call it the wall of tears because it is said to emanate eerie cries and have a heavy energy surrounding it.

**Day 15: Sierra Negra Volcano - Free day**

Early morning around 07.00 a.m. we will have a tours to Sierra Negra Volcano it's one of the five volcanoes on the island of Isabela, and boasts the second largest volcanic caldera in the world ( **Yellowstone National Park in the United States is the largest in case You were wondering** ). On the sierra Negra Volcano You hike to the rim of the six miles wide crater and then trek across an alien landscape of lava fields and fumaroles. The Sierra Negra is one of the most active volcanoes in the Galapagos, with the last eruption in 2005 Though You probably won't see any lava flowing, You will have the opportunity to explore thermal vents and other fascinating geologic features before stopping for a snack near volcán Chico. The vistas from this spot are among the most breathtaking in Isabela and on clear afternoons afford views of the northern volcanoes on Isabela and Fernandina. A savory hot lunch at Campo Duro rounds out this challenging but rewarding day

You will spend the night in one of the nicest hotels in town.
